## INTRODUCTION



### **Unlock the Packaging Locks**

# **PRODUCT FEATURES**

#### 1. House Front

The front of the house features different interactions, such as: opening and closing the door, window, and postbox; flipping the switch, and pressing the cat.



### 2. Roof

The roof of the house features a chimney to drop the balls and tissues through, as well as a 4-piece shape sorter.





#### 3. Gear Side

The left side of the house features interactive gears to spin.



### 4. Stretchy Sides

The right side and back of the house feature colourful stretchy bands. Put the tissues, balls, and shapes through the bands and then pull them back out.



### Ways to Play

Below are some ideas to inspire play.

#### 1. Hide and Seek

Object permanence is knowing an object exists even when you can't see it. Help your baby learn about object permanence by taking a tissue and partially hiding a ball underneath it. Then ask your baby, "Where did the ball go?" Slowly reveal the ball by pulling the tissue. Repeat as many times as your baby seems interested. As your baby develops a better understanding of object permanence, you can hide the ball completely underneath the tissue and encourage them to find it.

### 2. Label and Find

Teach children how to describe objects and recognise each object's unique features. Direct them to find specific play pieces based on different descriptors, for example: *Find a brown dog. Find the red ball.* 

Find the block with the chicken.

#### **3. Spatial Vocabulary**

Your child is learning new words every day. Expose your little one to new spatial vocabulary words to describe where play pieces are in relation to one another, for example,

The ball is inside the house The cat is behind the bush. The ladybird is on top of the postbox.

### 4. Compare Shapes

With four unique shapes, little ones can look at two blocks at a time and observe their similarities and differences. Point out the sides, curves, and corners of each block to bring their attention to the attributes of different shapes.
